What is the Rhodes Scholarship?

- Established in 1902, the Rhodes Scholarship is the oldest and perhaps most prestigious international scholarship programme in the world.
- It is a fully-funded postgraduate award which enables talented young people from around the world to study full-time at the University of Oxford.
- Rhodes Scholars come to the UK for two or more years and can apply to study most full-time postgraduate courses in almost any field offered by the University of Oxford.

What is the Rhodes Scholarship?

- The Rhodes Scholarship is merit-based, with the purpose of developing public-spirited leaders, and to promote international understanding and peace through an international community of Scholars.
- There is no such thing as a 'type' when considering who gets selected.
- Today's Rhodes Scholars include medical researchers, social workers, Presidents, Prime Ministers, artists, journalists, lawyers, teachers, activists, poets, doctors and many more!

What does the Rhodes Scholarship cover?

- Following selection for the Scholarship, the Rhodes Trust will cover the fee required to apply to study at the University of Oxford, as well as your course (and college) fees.
- The Rhodes Scholarship also provides an annual stipend to cover living costs, including accommodation and food.
- The Trust will cover the fee for a Tier 4 study visa and the associated International Health Surcharge (IHS).
- We cover two economy class flights to and from the UK for the beginning and end of studies in Oxford. On arrival in Oxford, Scholars also receive a settling in allowance.





What makes the Scholarship Unique?

In addition to your college and department, you will also have Rhodes House

- This is where the Warden, the Registrar and our dedicated Scholar Team are based. They are present to support you and help ensure your academic, professional and personal success.
- It has study spaces, a library, a café and communal spaces where you will meet other Scholars.
- Rhodes House hosts talks, seminars and forums with world-leading experts, academics and guests.
- Scholars also attend social events such as the Coming Up Dinner and the Rhodes Ball.







What makes the Scholarship Unique?

Character, Service and Leadership Programme (CSLP)

This is the flagship programme at the core of the Rhodes Scholar experience, providing many different and varied opportunities to learn, connect, and engage across three key areas:

Are you eligible?

Each year, 100+ Rhodes Scholarships are awarded to students from 25 constituencies (country or group of countries):

Are you eligible?

Each applicant must fulfil the citizenship and residency requirements of the Rhodes constituency for which they are applying.



Age limits vary between constituencies, ranging between 18 to 24 years and up to a maximum of 27 years in exceptional circumstances.

You must have completed an undergraduate degree (usually a Bachelor's) by July 2026, and you must have an academic background and grade that – at a minimum — meets or exceeds the specific entry requirements of your chosen course at the University of Oxford.

Candidates will have a higher chance of successful admission to University of Oxford if they have:

- A first class Honours degree or equivalent, or,
- GPA of 3.7/4.0 or higher
